Geri Reynolds Retires

After nearly 40 years of service to the Driftwood Players, Geri Reynolds is retiring from the Driftwood Board of Trustees.

Geri's most famous role at the Driftwood is likely the title role in Driftwood's premier performance in our current theater, "Auntie Mame". The Aberdeen venue provided a beautiful space that highlighted a wonderful performance that is still talked about.

Geri came to the Driftwood in 1974, playing Elvira in Blithe Spirit. Before her Driftwood debut, Geri had worked as a model and had extensive experience in radio and television in Seattle, Portland and San Francisco. She spent many years as an elementary teacher in Aberdeen.

Geri won Driftwood's most prestigious award, the Mabs George Service Award in 1998. She also won Best Supporting Ac-

tress Awards for Charlie's Aunt in 1980 and Blithe Spirit in 1990. Her other acting credits include Suddenly at Home, Everybody Loves Opal, Hay Fever, The Sunshine Boys, Beau Jest, The Cemetery Club, Lend Me a Tenor, Ring Round the Moon, The Vagina Monologues, and Inspecting Carol.

Geri has been a great volunteer for the Driftwood, serving in many capacities to make sure the show went on. Most recently, she would address the newsletters and mailings that you receive.

She also spent many shows (too many to count) working stage crew. As she has noted the backstage crew "can make or break a good production" and she was always happy to make all of our shows great.

A 1940s Radio Christmas Carol

The Driftwood Players present the holiday musical comedy, A 1940's Radio Christmas Carol, directed by Kathe Rowe.

It's Christmas Eve, 1943, and the Feddington Players are now broadcasting from a hole-in-the-wall studio in Newark, NJ, and set to present their contemporary "take" on Dickens's A Christmas Carol. Whether it's the noisy plumbing, missed cues, electrical blackouts, or the over-the-top theatrics of veteran actor, but radio novice, William St. Claire, this radio show is an entertaining excursion into the mayhem and madness of a live radio show. St. Claire's escalating foibles and acting missteps propel the show to a simultaneously comedic and heart-wrenching dramatic climax: St. Claire has an on-air breakdown, and begins to connect his own life with that of the classic Dickens tale. In order to "save the show," the company improvises an ending to Charles Dickens' classic as a film noir mystery, featuring a hardboiled

detective, a femme fatale, and an absurd rescue of Tiny Tim (and the Lindbergh baby) from the clutches of a Hitler-esque villain named Rudolf!








Audition Alert
