Time Now for The Last Five Years

Theatre lovers have many opportunities in Driftwood's production of *The Last Five Years*, which opens April 27, to blissfully geek out.

Director Sara Henry, along with Co-Director and Musical Director Alex Eddy, has scheduled talkbacks after the Sunday matinees on May 6 and May 13. The audience will be invited to stay after the performance for a Q-and-A session with the actors and directors to discuss the process of working through the roles and developing the show.

Sara has provided two casts for the two-character show: Jerrod Phelps and Tamara Helland (as Jamie Wellerstein and Cathy Hiatt) and Christian Fruto and Kendall Cavin will alternate performances throughout the run (see schedule at right). Sara says we're going to see different shows and that we should see both. The actors understand the singular "goal of the show" that she gave them, but "it's being done differently because they are four different actors." The distinct performances will give the audience a chance to rethink their opinion of the characters and perhaps to achieve a deeper understanding of the story.

The musical itself, written by Jason Robert Brown, employs an unconventional storytelling technique. The story examines the five year ro-

mantic relationship of a successful writer, Jamie Wellerstein, and an aspiring actress, Cathy Hiatt, from beginning to breakup. Sara says that time is the third character in the show, and Jamie and Cathy sing their stories separately, in inverse chronological order: Cathy begins at the end and moves toward the beginning, while Jamie starts at the beginning and sings to the end. The characters only interact directly in a touching wedding duet in the middle of the play. The songs, however, relate the characters thematically across time; for example, at one point Jamie sings about his success as a writer at the beginning of the relationship, while Cathy is struggling as an actress near the end.

There is minimal dialogue in the show, resulting in what Sara describes as an 80-minute marathon for the singers, who are accompanied solely by Alex on piano. The simple accompaniment mirrors the simplicity of Julanyne Fleury's set design, which approximates a black box set and has no defined locations.

Tickets for *The Last Five Years* are \$15. Rush tickets are available at the door only for \$10 with a student ID. For this production, Driftwood has also added two special, pay-what-you-can performances, on Thursday nights, May 3 and May 10. As Alex shared recently on social media, for

those two shows "if all you can afford to spend ... is a buck, we'll take it! Similarly, if you've always thought the tickets for Driftwood are severely underpriced, feel free to come and lay down a fifty!"

We think this show is gonna be worth fifty bucks.
