
It was a hell of a ride and we can't wait for the next show.

The Gin Game. Winner of the 1978 Pulitzer Prize, which originally starred Jessica Tandy and Hume Cronyn, Gin Game uses a card game as a metaphor for life.

While playing solitaire on the porch of a seedy nursing home, Weller Martin meets prim and self righteous Fonsia Dorsey.

They discover they both dislike the home and enjoy gin rummy, so they begin to play and reveal intimate details of their lives.

Gin Game stars Brad Duffy and Pat Sibley and is directed by Stacey Hopkins. This will be Hopkins first production as a Driftwood director.

How to Tune into Gin Game

Livestreaming is new for a lot of us. So for those still unsure about how to tune into a livestream, fear not. We have a step by step guide on how you can tune into our next livestream production.

- 1. Purchase a ticket at least 5 minutes before the show starts. Tickets can be purchased on our website aberdeendriftwood.com
- 2. Wait for an email. Once a ticket is purchased, you will receive an email with a link to our Youtube Channel.
- 3. Click the link and you will be redirected to the livestream.
- 4. Grab some popcorn and enjoy the show.

IMPORTANT EMINDER:

Once you purchase a ticket, you will have 24hrs to watch the production once it has started. So you need not worry if you can't make it to the show on time.

You can also pause and rewind at your leisure. Which is perfect for those mid show bathroom emergencies.

Also, patrons don't need to purchase multiple tickets for one performance. Only ONE ticket per household needs to be purchased.




